For Families and Carers:

Mums Social Group

Monthly social outings and one weekend away per year for mothers of a child with a disability.

Dads Social Group

Monthly social outings and one weekend away per year for father s of a child with a disability.

Carer Support Groups

Regular workshops, social outings and information sharing for carers. Currently located in Maroondah, Knox, Whitehorse, Yarra Ranges and Boroondara.

Family Camp

A chance for families to get away together and build friendships and a support network with other families. Usually two per year.

Grandparent Carers Program

Workshops, social connection and resources for grandparent carers.

Host Program

Matches a child with a disability with a volunteer host, who shares their home and time with that child on a regular basis.

Sibling Support Program

Age based camps and day activities for the siblings of a child with a disability.

Youth Hangout (Millgrove)

Autism Program (Ferntree Gully)

Promoting independence, friendship and fun for children aged 9-13 with ASD who attend mainstream school

Reactions (Boronia)

Two age-based fun weekly performance and dance groups. All welcome, from 5-18+ years.

Woori Yallock After School Program

Inclusive after school program for children with disability or extra support needs, and their siblings, attending Woori Yallock Primary.
