Host Program

The Host Program matches a child with a disability, aged to 18 years, with a volunteer host who shares their home and time with that child on a regular basis.

Arrangements around actual periods of care are flexible, to fit in with the needs of family, child and host. However, Interchange encourages regular monthly visits, as this assists the relationship between the child and their host family to develop, so everyone feels comfortable and at ease with each other.

Initially the prospective host, the child and their family all meet, giving everyone the opportunity to get to know a little about each other. For the match process to continue, everyone must give their agreement. Hosts come from all cultural and religious backgrounds, lifestyle and relationship situations and can be any age over 18 years. The role the host plays can also be very different – another 'family', friend, buddy – each host contributes in their unique way to the hosting program.

With the hosting program, parents have the reassurance that their child is being cared for in a loving and welcoming family or friendship situation. A CrimCheck, reference checks and home check are done on all prospective hosts and all hosts must also have a Working with Children clearance.

To enable them to provide the best possible care, hosts are provided with comprehensive information about their host child. Interchange believes that parents are the best source of information regarding the care of their child and open communication is encouraged between parents and hosts. Interchange staff provide ongoing support throughout the match. Creating Opportunities & Choice.

- Arrangements are flexible to suit families, individuals and host volunteers
- Host volunteers are carefully matched with children based on interests, experience, personality, availability and many other factors
- Interchange Outer East provides ongoing support throughout the hosting relationship.
- A CrimCheck, reference checks, interviews and home check are all carried out before host volunteers are registered.

It's a rest from the carer role, time to unwind and enjoy those things in life that are difficult to do when your child is home.

It's an opportunity to spend quality time

with other siblings and family members, without the need to care for your child with higher needs. It's free respite, with the knowledge that your child is in a safe, caring environment with someone who enjoys spending time with them.

For Community

It's greater awareness, understanding and acceptance of differences in people. An inclusive community is a healthier and happier community; a community where all members are valued.
